The Reily Cup

What is it?

A year long points race, beginning in the fall semester and ending in the spring semester, in which the same team and team members participate together in Intramural Sports, earning points for sportsmanship, participation, and winning, for the chance to be crowned Reily Cup Champions.

Who's Eligible?

1. Any team eligible for Intramural play is eligible to participate in the Reily Cup.
2. All eligibility rules for Intramurals apply in the Reily Cup.
3. The Reily Cup offers three leagues of competition for a chance to win the Reily Points Race:
 - a. Greek League: within the Reily Cup there is the Greek Cup with a Fraternity and Sorority Division. A Greek Trophy and bragging rights are up for grabs. Fraternities and sororities will compete against each other throughout the year to earn points to be crowned the top Fraternity and Sorority Intramural Champion.
 - b. Open League: the Open League consists of Men's Open Division, Women's Open Division, and Residence Hall Division. These divisions will compete against each other to earn points to be crowned the Reily Cup Champions.
 - c. Co-Recreational League: will compete against other Co-rec teams to earn points to be crowned the Co-Rec Reily Cup Champions.
4. A participant may participate on one Reily Cup Team within the Greek or Open Divisions. A participant may participate on a Co-Recreational Reily Points team and in a Greek or Open Division Reily IM Points team.

If the Women's teams are competing for the same trophy as the Men's teams does that mean the women's teams will play the men's teams?

No, the women's teams are competing with the men's teams for points, but they will never meet on the playing field.

How do I sign a team up?

On each Sport Entry Form there is a box to check if you want to be registered as a Reily Cup Team. Once a participant plays on a team they are a member of that Reily Cup Team. They may not participate on another Reily Points Team.

Can we add participants to the Reily Points Roster?

Yes, but it must be done within the time frame stated in the Intramural Handbook.

Do we have to keep the same team name for each sport and semester?

Yes, a Reily Cup Team must keep the same team name for each sport and semester they participate in that year so that the Intramural Department can keep track of the team's points that are earned throughout the year.

Is winning the only way to earn points?

No, winning is just one way to earn points. Teams can also earn points through good sportsmanship, and participation in all events.

How can the team earn points?

Teams can earn points in several ways depending on the sport and format. (All points will be rounded off the nearest tenth of a point.)

1. Team League Sports
 - a. Team League Sports include:
 - i. Flag Football
 - ii. 5x5 Basketball
 - iii. Indoor Soccer
 - iv. Outdoor Soccer
 - v. Softball
 - vi. Volleyball
 - b. Teams in League Sports can earn points in two ways:
 - i. Sportsmanship Points: The season ending sportsmanship rating for each team in each sport will be multiplied by 50.
Example: A team finishes the Softball season with a 2.5 sportsmanship rating. $2.5 \times 50 = 125$ points. The team earns 125 sportsmanship points in Softball. If a team has an average below 2.25 they will be awarded zero sportsmanship points for that sport.
 - ii. Competitive Points: The team's season ending win percentage will be multiplied by 150. Example: A team finishes the indoor soccer season with 6 wins, 2 losses and 1 tie. There are a total of twelve games available in the indoor soccer season, including playoffs games. Ties will be counted as half a point; playoff games not played because a team was eliminated will be counted as a loss.
 $6.5 / 12 = .541 \times 150 = 81.2$ points
2. Team Tournaments
 - a. Team Tournaments (4 people or more) include:
 - i. Dodge Ball
 - ii. 4x4 Flag Football
 - iii. Water Volleyball
 - iv. Water Basketball
 - b. Teams in Team Tournaments of 4 people or more can earn points in two ways:

- i. Participation Points: A team will receive 100 points for registering to compete in the tournament. If a team forfeits they will receive no participation points.
 - ii. Competitive Points: The team’s tournament ending win percentage will be multiplied by 100.
 - c. A Reily Cup team can enter one team for team tournament of (4 people or more) made up from the Reily IM Points Race team’s roster.
 - d. Team Tournaments (2 or 3 people) include:
 - i. Tennis Doubles
 - ii. Ping Pong Doubles
 - iii. 3x3 Basketball
 - iv. Badminton Doubles
 - v. Spades
 - vi. Racquetball Doubles
 - e. Teams can earn points in two ways:
 - i. Participation Points: A team will receive 50 points for registering to compete in the tournament. If a team forfeits they will receive no participation points.
 - ii. Competitive Points: The team’s tournament ending win percentage will be multiplied by 50.
 - iii. Example: Reily IM Points Team “Big Dog” enters two teams in the Spades Tournament Team “Big Dog 1” and Team “Big Dog 2”. Neither team forfeits, team Big Dog 1 receives five wins and team Big Dog 2 receives four wins out of a total of five possible games.

- iv. Team Big Dog receives a total of 190 points from the participation of the two teams in the Spades Tournament that will be added to the Team’s grand total.
 - f. A Reily Cup team can enter three teams for team tournament of (2 or 3 people) made up from the Reily Cup team’s roster.
 - g. The first three teams entered from a Reily Cup team’s roster will be eligible to earn points.
 - h. Other teams from the roster can enter but are not eligible to score points.
- 3. Individual Tournaments/Leagues
 - a. Individual Tournaments include:
 - i. Ping Pong
 - ii. Badminton
 - iii. Racquetball
 - iv. Tennis

- v. Handball
 - b. A Reily Cup team can enter eight individuals from the team's roster that will be eligible to score points.
 - c. Other individuals from the roster can enter but are not eligible to score points.
 - d. Individuals can earn points in two ways:
 - i. Participation Points: An individual will receive 25 points for competing in the tournament. If an individual forfeits they will receive no participation points.
 - ii. Competitive Points: The team's tournament ending win percentage will be multiplied by 25.
4. Individual Events
- a. Individual Events include:
 - i. Weight Lifting
 - ii. Track Meet
 - iii. Football Skills Challenge
 - iv. March Madness Basketball Challenge
 - v. Strong Man
 - vi. McAlister Mile
 - vii. Biathlon
 - b. A Reily Cup team can enter eight individuals from the team's roster that will be eligible to score points.
 - c. Other individuals from the roster can enter but are not eligible to score points.
 - d. Individuals can earn points in two ways:
 - i. Participation Points: An individual will receive 25 points for competing in the tournament. If an individual forfeits their Reily IM Points Team will receive no points.
 - ii. Competitive Points per event:

1 st	20 points	5 th	8 points
2 nd	16 points	6 th	6 points
3 rd	12 points	7 th	4 points
4 th	10 points	8 th	2 points

- 5. The more sport events a team participates in, the higher their sportsmanship ratings are, the more wins they get, the more points a team will earn.

Can teams lose points?

Teams can lose participation points if they forfeit a game. All other points earned cannot be lost.

Where and when will scores be posted?

Scores will be posted on www.reilycenter.com and on the Intramural bulletin board at the end of the business day on Tuesday.

What do we win?

The top fraternity and sorority in the Greek Cup will have their team names engraved on the Greek IM Trophy. The trophy will be displayed in the Reily Center for all to see. The fraternity and sorority will each receive a plaque that it can have to display with pride. Pictures of the champions will be posted on the Intramural Web Site. With this also come year-long bragging rights, as they become the crowned champions of the Greek League.

The winner of the Reily Cup for the Open Division and Co-Recreational Division will each have its team name engraved on the Reily IM Trophy. The Trophy will be displayed in the Reily Center for all to see. The winners in the Open Division and Co-Recreational will each receive a plaque that it can have to display with pride. Pictures of the champions will be posted on the Intramural Web Site. With this also come year-long bragging rights as they are the crowned Reily Center IM Overall Champions of the year.
